



Victorian Certificate of Applied Learning (Senior)

OVERVIEW

The Victorian Certificate of Applied Learning (VCAL) is a senior secondary qualification and is accredited with the Victorian Qualifications Authority. At senior level, students are expected to demonstrate a high level of interpersonal skills, independent action and achievement of tasks that require decision-making and leadership skills. All students will be expected to design a community project and provide leadership to their project team. Students must have successfully completed VCAL at Intermediate level prior to commencing senior units (or have other approved prior qualifications). This level also includes mandatory industry days, where students will spend time in one of three selected vocational streams - Creative Industries or Hospitality. Please contact Wodonga TAFE to arrange a pre-training interview to determine the level of VCAL you will undertake.

** You must not apply online until your VCAL level has been determined at the pre-training interview.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

Literacy skills - Learners who successfully complete this unit will be able to read, comprehend and write a range of complex texts across a broad range of contexts

Numeracy skills - Learners will explore mathematics beyond familiar and everyday use and develop numeracy skills in the mathematical areas of numbers and data; financial literacy; time and location; measurement and design. Learners who successfully complete this unit are expected to have the capacity to interpret and analyse how mathematics is represented and used in their personal lives and in a practical context within a workplace environment.

Work Related Skills - Learners will be required to demonstrate employability skills at a high level including; planning, organisation, critical thinking, problem solving and communication skills and be able to apply these in a complex work-related project

Personal Development - Learners will develop leadership and team work skills including decision making, goal setting, cultural awareness, problem solving, communication and critical reflection. They will be required to design and implement a community project that demonstrates social engagement and civic and civil responsibility.

Industry specific skills - Learners gain specific skills tailored to thrive in particular industries.

SELECTABLE UNITS

Additional selectable units apply depending on the vocational/industry area chosen for VCAL. Your VCAL enrolment will include enrolment into various units of competency from either Creative Industries or Hospitality training package.

ASSESSMENT

The assessments will enable students to demonstrate the underpinning knowledge, skills and attributes required to meet the course outcomes. A range of assessment strategies to meet different student's needs will be selected, and may include organising and facilitating a group project, oral presentations, preparation of a portfolio and online activities.

CERTIFICATION

Combining prior study (if applicable) and upon successful completion of this course you will be awarded a Senior VCAL certificate and a statement of attainment from Victorian Curriculum Assessment Authority.

CAREERS

Successful completion of this course may lead to apprenticeships or traineeships, and employment.
