



## WORK SKILLS FOR LIFE

### OVERVIEW

This short course is designed to support post-school-age students with permanent intellectual disabilities. Students are supported to experience many opportunities to boost their confidence, learn new skills, meet new people, and engage with education and community. Students take part in vocational tasters across a variety of industry areas that may include choices from kitchen operations, hospitality, floristry, horticulture, landscaping, engineering, fitness, recreation, community services, creative industries, or building and construction. Students engage in practical hands-on activities and work together to achieve team projects throughout the year. Students also visit a range of different industries and local businesses throughout the local region.
