OVERVIEW

Learn the technical agricultural skills and knowledge you need as a skilled tradesperson in an agricultural workplace. Your studies focus on working with plants, animals, machinery and equipment, occupational health and safety (OH&S), people, administration and business.

ASSESSMENT

The assessments enable students to demonstrate the underpinning knowledge, skills and attributes required to meet the course outcomes. These assessments may include a combination of demonstration of skills, completion of written tasks, and the creation of portfolios.

CERTIFICATION

By successfully completing this course you will receive an AQF Qualification.

CAREERS

Successful completion of this qualification will enable you to enter the agricultural industries in an entry-level role. You may find work as a farm or station hand, or farm or station worker.

DELIVERY METHODS

- o Workplace – Some/all teaching and assessment will be conducted at your workplace
- o Traineeship – Teaching and assessment will be required to be conducted as part of a traineeship

DURATION

Traineeship 18 - 24 months, training in classroom, via workshops and onsite mentoring. Public applicants, Part Time, 18 - 24 months, training in classroom, via workshops and onsite mentoring.

DELIVERY SCHEDULE

Variable depending on traineeship or non-traineeship arrangement.

REQUIREMENTS

- You need basic literacy skills and numeracy skills.
- Some electives are more physically demanding and do require you to be physically capable to undertake the work activities. You can discuss this further with your trainer.
- Farm access and an interview are requirements prior to being accepted into the course.

FEES

From 1 January 2019, Free TAFE for Priority Courses is a Victorian Government program that will pay your tuition fees to study in this selected course at Wodonga TAFE, if you're eligible, subject to minimum numbers.
