



## Certificate IV in Interior Decoration

### OVERVIEW

This qualification focuses on the essential skills you need to be successful in this exciting growth industry. You will work with real-life client briefs and engage directly with industry to develop your concepts into fully resolved solutions for your client. Successful completion of this course offers you a pathway and one year's credit into the Diploma of Interior Design and Decoration.

## FIELD PLACEMENT

There are no field placements associated with this course, students receive extensive and direct industry engagement during the course. All students have the opportunity to exhibit their work at various points throughout the year. All students participate in a major exhibition in November each year. This is an excellent opportunity to start or extend your exhibition practice for your portfolio.

## REQUIREMENTS

- Full-time delivery (day-time course): there are no formal entry requirements, however we recommend that you have completed Year 10 as a minimum, or that you enrol as a mature-aged student. A pre-training interview is required prior to entry into the course.
- Part-time blended learning delivery (evening course): you need to have high-level digital skills with some industry experience. Your suitability for this delivery type will be determined at an interview with the course coordinator. A pre-training interview is required prior to entry into the course.
